**ABOUT THE FESTIVAL**  
**From Mozart to Mozaic**

*"Here, surely, are people who know how to live, as well as to love music – if indeed they are not the same thing. In San Luis Obispo, at any rate, you are among true friends."* - Bernard Levin, [The Listener], from his review of the Festival, August 1981.



The San Luis Obispo Mozart Festival was founded by Clifton Swanson in 1971.

The Festival began modestly with three performances over a weekend. However, it grew rapidly to six, nine, and then eleven concerts. By 1983, the San Luis Obispo Mozart Festival presented 19 concerts. In its early days, the Festival featured primarily orchestral and choral music, but over the decades has offered an ever-expanding range of programming, including early music, period instrument concerts, jazz, contemporary music, opera, chamber music, solo recitals, world music and much more.

Throughout its history, the Mozart Festival has attracted a share of luminaries, up-and-coming artists and exceptionally talented orchestral, choral, and musicians who come to participate in great music making and to enjoy the pleasures of the Central Coast. Music critic Greg Hettmansberger wrote, in the prestigious *Performing Arts Magazine* that the Festival offered a "stunning variety of venues" and "unique and provocative artists," and that it is an "aesthetic extravaganza."

In 2005, Clifton Swanson passed the baton to Scott Yoo, who has since led the Festival in exciting and bold directions, showcasing amazing music in amazing spaces performed by amazing musicians.

In 2008, the Festival adopted the name Festival Mozaic to honor the rich legacy of the enduring universality, creativity and spirit of one of the greatest musicians the world has known and to embrace the mosaic of music created here. The Festival's impeccable and spirited performances by our guest artists and musicians, all masters of the classical style, bring Mozart's timeless masterworks to life, alongside the best of the world's musical influences with orchestral performances, chamber music, world music, jazz, and informative and educational musical experiences.

**Clifton Swanson, Founder/Music director Emeritus**



One of the original founders of the San Luis Obispo Mozart Festival, Clif served as Music Director and Principal Conductor for over 30 years, helping the Festival to grow from three concerts on a weekend in early August 1971 to over 30 concerts and numerous other events today. In addition to conducting the San Luis Obispo Symphony from 1971 to 1984, he is an active string bass player and served as Principal Bass of the San Luis Obispo Symphony from 1985 to 2005. Chair of the Music Department at Cal Poly from 1984 to 1996 and then again from 1999 until his retirement in 2004, Clif has played an important role in the musical scene of San Luis Obispo since joining the faculty in 1967. During his tenure as department chair, the B.A. in Music degree was developed and has achieved an excellent reputation. Cal Poly's music graduates have distinguished themselves in many areas, from teaching and performance to graduate studies and research. Clif founded the Cal Poly Chamber Orchestra in 1967. He received the President's award for contributions to the Arts in San Luis Obispo County and the College of Engineering's Award for the Outstanding Professor in the School of Liberal Arts. Clif continues to be active in the music scene and enjoys gardening and landscaping.

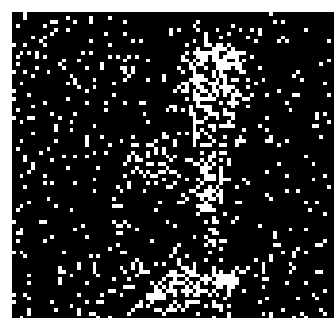

## Scott Yoo, Music Director



After beginning his musical studies at age 14, Scott Yoo performed and debuted his Violin Concerto with the Boston Symphony at age 16. He received First Prize in the 1988 Janshin Violin Competition, the 1989 Young Concert Artists International Auditions, and the 1994 Avery Fisher Competition. In 1993, Mr. Yoo founded the Korean-American Chamber Orchestra, conducting his ensemble in its second program hall in Boston and more than ninety performances in Korea.

Scott Yoo has collaborated with conductors Hideo Sato, Chung-Kwang Moon, Realdo Valente, and Masa Tsumura, and performed with the Chicago Festival Orchestra, the Tokyo Chamber Orchestra, the Princeton College Music Festival and PRISM Ensemble, the Seoul Chamber Orchestra, and the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

As a guest conductor, Mr. Yoo has led the Chicago, Dallas, Indianapolis, New York, San Francisco and Utah Symphonies, the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, and led the 2009 Carnegie Festival, as well as numerous other festival series. In June 2009, he led the City of London Sinfonia at the 2009 Proms, the Lincoln Center Festival at Lincoln Center, the Dallas Chamber Orchestra, the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, the Estonian National Symphony, and several seasons, Mr. Yoo made debuts with the Seoul Philharmonic and the Seoul Chamber Orchestra in Korea, and conducted the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra in Carnegie Hall with violinist Joo Myung.

A proponent of the music of his time, Mr. Yoo has premiered 60 works by 21 composers. With Melamorphosis, Mr. Yoo has recorded Mark O'Connor's entire four seasons for New Musical, joined the Grammy-nominated artists to work with him and Drew Cash for 2008 Grammy nomination and a 2009 Grammy Public Radio Performance Today award, and sang by himself with soprano Renée Valente and Karo Deindl to play *Walden* in 2007. Other projects with the New York Philharmonic include projects featuring the work of Lar Kim with the NY Philharmonic, and the Mar Maroon and works of Eliah Chikava with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center with strings.

Mr. Yoo has appeared at numerous festivals with the San Francisco, Utah, Chicago, Dallas Chamber Orchestras, the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center, and the Seattle Chamber Music Society.

Mr. Yoo studied with David Tuckwell, Roger Alford, Murray Perahya, and Dorothy DeBor, and performed with Mitchell Gilman, and Michael Tilson Thomas.

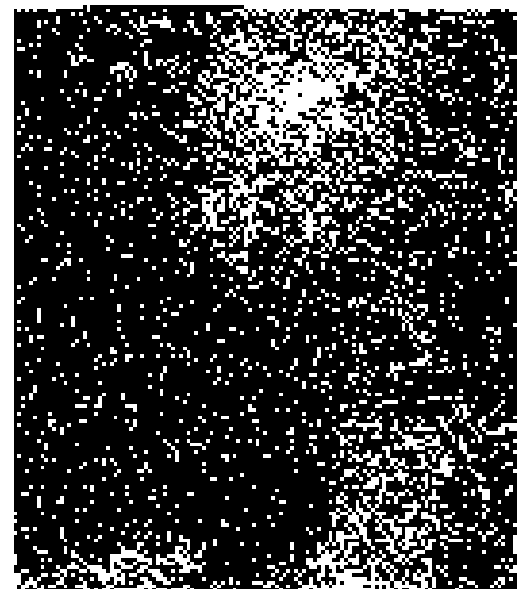

## 2013 Fringe Artists



### String Theory

is a hybrid performance ensemble featuring multidisciplinary, dramatic, choreographic and visual installations. The ensemble was founded as an instrumental design and performance collective by interdisciplinary director, Joey Schachtel, and colleagues. Composed of seven members, String Theory comprises a multi-instrumental group including string quartet (violin, viola, cello, double bass), guitar, harp, saxophone, piano, drums, and electronic music. Their music ranges from 19th century Romantic era to 21st century experimental, contemporary and electronic, and the

performances incorporate large scale instruments and liturgical landscape features created by the installation. Founding member, Joe Schachtel, is a 2011 National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship Fellow. In 2010, Holly Ebert received the Illinois Arts Council Board Fellowship. The ensemble is a special membership.



### Duo Baldo
