

SCOTT YOO, VIOLIN AND MUSIC DIRECTOR

Conducts and performs with orchestras around the world. A first-prize winner in the Josef Gingold International Violin competition, Scott has also received an Avery Fisher Career Grant for his many

accomplishments as a violinist and conductor.



JASON UYEYAMA, VIOLIN

Has performed in recitals throughout the U.S. and Canada and recently made his recital debut in Japan. He is the Director of String Studies at La Sierra University and performs regularly with the Los Angeles Philharmonic.



PAUL SEVERTSON, VIOLA

Is Co-Concertmaster of the San Luis Obispo Symphony Orchestra and a founding member of the Tolosa Strings Chamber Ensemble. He has been performing with the Festival since 1993.



MADELEINE KABAT, CELLO

Has performed as soloist with the Cleveland Orchestra. She won top prizes in the Klein, Fischoff, Hellam, and William C. Byrd International Competitions, and serves as a substitute cellist for the Houston Symphony and Orpheus Chamber Orchestra.


SHIRLEY RITTER-Has had a varied career as school teacher, retailer and artist. She served as a board member of the Nevada Museum of Art
